Proposed Selwyn District Plan

The Proposed Selwyn District Plan was notified on 5 October 2020 and HortNZ was an active participant in the plan change process focusing on achieving the best planning framework to support existing horticultural activity and future industry growth.

Decisions on submissions on the Proposed Plan were notified on 17 January 2022 and hearings of submissions and further submissions were held between August 2021 and May 2023.

Key changes/provisions

HortNZ appealed a number of decisions to the Environment Court and this summary provides detail on recently issued decisions on:

- Rural industry
 - Rural contractors deport exempt from hours of operation however customer and deliveries will only be allowed from 7am and 7pm

• Artificial Crop Protection Structures (ACPS) and Crop Support Structures (CCS)

- ACPS and CCS less than 6m in height, and with black or green shade cloth on vertical faces fronting an internal boundary in different ownership or a road boundary, can be setback 3m from an internal boundary and 5m from a road boundary
- Where over 6m in height or using a colour other than black or green cloth on vertical faces fronting an internal boundary in different ownership or a road boundary, a 5m setback from an internal boundary and 10m from a road boundary is required
- Wildfire Management
 - Visitor accommodation in the rural zone is to be set back 30m from an internal boundary, a boundary that is a state highway or arterial road by 20m, a road boundary that is an 'other road' by 10m
- Noise
 - A new policy is added to the Noise chapter that provides for rural production activities that generate noise provided they are compatible with the character and amenity of the receiving zone

HortNZ is still in mediation or awaiting consent orders on a number of other topics. These are expected to be resolved in the first half of 2025.
